After speaking with Don this morning, I reviewed our squads' conditions and millage as well as speaking with Deputy Wolff who uses our oldest car extensively. While the original plan was to replace our 2017 squad in 2025, we believe that it is still in sufficient condition and millage that we can push that date back. My current plan and recommendation would be to replace our 2017 squad in 2027. That would put the squad at a decade of service and due for replacement. I haven't looked at the 2021 car, but provided that it retains its condition as well as the 2017 has, I would use the same standard and plan for replacing it in 2031.
