Assessment

The last revaluation of all property was performed for the 2008 assessment year. To maintain compliance with the State of Wisconsin, the Village will undergo a revaluation for the 2024 assessment year. A revaluation is a complete and thorough review of all property assessments. During a revaluation year, all assessments are examined, and adjustments are made to guarantee that all property is assessed at 100% of market value. This revaluation will not include any onsite visits.

Village Treasurer

Village staff is working hard on completing the 2024 budget. Once the budget is finalized and adopted, the information is sent to Ozaukee County for mailing of the tax bills.

Tax bills will be mailed mid-December. You have the option of paying your tax bill in full or in two installments. The first installment or payment in full, is due on or before January 31. Public services rely on this tax revenue, so prompt payment is appreciated. Village Hall and PWSB-Fredonia Branch will accept payments for the first installment.

The second installment is due on or before July 31 at the Ozaukee County Treasurer's office.

Water and sewer utilities are billed quarterly: January, April, July, and October. All residents have the option to sign up for paperless billing – your bill will be sent right to your inbox rather than your mailbox. This saves the Village in processing and mailing a hard copy bill. Sign up today by using the forms found on the Treasurer's page of the Village's website! Sincerely,
